The Minister prays,

Living God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Ministry of the Word

The first reading is from the book of the Prophet Micah, chapter 6 verses 1 to 8.

1Listen to what the Lord says:

"Stand up, plead my case before the mountains; let the hills hear what you have to say.

2"Hear, you mountains, the Lord's accusation; listen, you everlasting foundations of the earth. For the Lord has a case against his people; he is lodging a charge against Israel.

3"My people, what have I done to you? How have I burdened you? Answer me. **4**I brought you up out of Egypt and redeemed you from the land of slavery. I sent Moses to lead you, also Aaron and Miriam. **5**My people, remember what Balak king of Moab plotted and what Balaam son of Beor answered. Remember your journey from Shittim to Gilgal, that you may know the righteous acts of the Lord." **6**With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? **7**Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?

8He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you?

To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

May your word live in us **and bear much fruit to your glory.**

The Psalm of the day is number 15.

We will read this psalm in alternate verse.

1Lord, who may dwell in your sacred tent?

Who may live on your holy mountain?

2**The one whose walk is blameless,**

who does what is righteous, who speaks the truth from their heart;

3whose tongue utters no slander, who does no wrong to a neighbour,

and casts no slur on others;

4**who despises a vile person but honours those who fear the Lord;**

who keeps an oath even when it hurts, and does not change their mind;

5who lends money to the poor without interest;

who does not accept a bribe against the innocent.

Whoever does these things will never be shaken.

Come, Holy Spirit, giver of life, breathe on your Church and make us a living people, holy and free. **Come Holy Spirit, bond of love, pour your love into our hearts that we may serve you with joy.**

2nd Reading is from Paul's first letter to the Church in Corinth, chapter 1, 18-31.

18For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. **19**For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."
20Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? **21**For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe. **22**Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, **23**but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, **24**but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. **25**For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

26Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. **27**But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. **28**God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, **29**so that no one may boast before him. **30**It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. **31**Therefore, as it is written: "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord."

Blessed are those who hear these words
and take to heart what is written, for the time is near.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord.

Confession and promise of forgiveness

In the presence of the One who walks amongst the seven lampstands in the temple of God, Jesus Christ the Son of God, let us bring our darkness to his radiant light, confessing our sins in repentance and faith,

**Holy God, we have disobeyed your commandments,
we have resisted your call, we have failed to live by your generous love.
We are sorry for all our sins, and ask you to forgive us,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The Minister will declare the promise of forgiveness:

God who is merciful and loving will not punish you as you deserve, nor repay you for your sins and wrongdoing. As high as the sky is above the earth, so great is his love for you; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed your sin from you. For those who have placed their faith and trust in our Lord Jesus Christ have been forgiven and made right with God. **Amen.**

Greeting of Peace

God so loved the world that he gave his own Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Through believing in Him, we have been washed. We have been sanctified. We have been redeemed. Let us therefore share in the peace we have received.

We are the body of Christ. **His Spirit is with us.**

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

Thanksgiving and Communion

The Lord be with you **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty Creator, ever-living God.

We give you thanks and praise for your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

For he is the true High Priest, who walks amongst the lampstands in the temple of God with the seven stars in his right hand.

He is the one who made us a royal priesthood to serve you, our God and Father.

You anointed him as Messiah, the light of the nations,

and revealed him as the hope of all who thirst for righteousness and peace.

By his death on the cross and rising to new life,

he offered the one true sacrifice for sin and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people.

Therefore, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven,

we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

And now, gracious God, we thank you for these gifts of bread and wine,

and pray that we who receive them, in the fellowship of Holy Spirit,

according to our Saviour's word, in remembrance of his suffering and death,

may share his body and blood.

On the night before he died, Jesus took bread,

and when he had given you thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying,

'Take and eat. This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' After supper, he took the cup, and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Let us proclaim the mystery of our faith,

Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again.

We eat this bread and drink this cup **to proclaim the death of the Lord.**

We do this until he returns. **Come, Lord Jesus!**

Father as we recall his saving death and glorious resurrection,
may we who share these gifts be renewed by your Holy Spirit
and united in the body of your Son.

Bring us with all your people into the joy of your eternal kingdom,
there to feast at your table and join in your eternal praise:

**Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive praise and honour
and glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.**
